1 **Introduction:**

3 It has been an honor to serve the OSMAA as President. It was an interesting year with many changes  
4 and challenges. It was only with the support of OSMA's wonderful staff (especially Nancy Bennett and  
5 Kathy Musson), and great OSMA/OSMAA board members that we were able to attempt new things and  
6 look forward to the future.

8 **REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES:**

10 **June 13–15, 2010:** We had four delegates at the American Medical Association Alliance Annual  
11 Meeting in Chicago. Donna Briggs, Past OSMAA Co-President from TCMS, Kathy Bookman –  
12 President-elect from OCMSA, Keith Oehlert – OCMSA and OSMAA Past President, and Debbie Sutor  
13 – President of OSMAA. We were there to represent our state and vote on many AMAA bylaw changes.

15 **September 9-10, 2010:** OSMAA had their first overnight retreat at The Canebrake in Wagoner,  
16 Oklahoma. We had excellent board participation with 18 members attending. We received only  
17 positive feedback and feel that the event was successful.

19 Linda Haneborg was our motivational guest speaker. Wes Glinsmann from OSMA spoke to us about  
20 social media and legislative highlights. Ken King also shared legislative information and updated us on  
21 OSMA activities. Barbara Jett, SMAA President, facilitated our brainstorming session regarding the  
22 future of OSMAA.

24 With the members being willing to pay for the majority of the cost, OSMA assistance, and Deaconess  
25 Hospital donating \$1200.00, the retreat did not affect the OSMAA budget.

27 **September 25-28, 2010:** AMAA had their first Medical Family Summit and Leadership Conference in  
28 Chicago. It was attended by Diana Hampton, M.D., Debbie Sutor, Kathy Bookman, Nancy Bennett,  
29 and Kathy Musson.

31 Although the conference had a new structure this year and was not as well attended, it was still  
32 beneficial for our group. The meeting gave the OSMAA leadership the opportunity to get to know each  
33 other better, learn from other state leadership, and to share our goals for the future.

35 **October 2010:** Was a very busy month across the state at the county level. Oklahoma County Medical  
36 Society Alliance had their Annual Kitchen Tour which raised over \$30,000.00. They donated \$15,000  
37 for Health Alliance for the Uninsured and \$15,000 for Hearts for Hearing. They have had several  
38 retreats and recommended several bylaw changes.

40 **November 15, 2010:** This included Planning and Development, Finance, and Nominating.  
41 Through Planning and Development we decided there is a need for increased electronic communication  
42 and visits to the counties.
