1 **INTRODUCTION:**

2
3 There are some powerful forces that work against the medical profession and an urgent need for
4 physicians to draw closer together and stay connected as a community of interest in these changing
5 times.

6 *“In medical practice as in life, change is the only constant . . . The impetus for health reform derives*
7 *from the evolving interplay between physicians, patients, hospitals, and insurers.”*

8 *--“Health Care Reform and the Decline of Private Physician Practice”*

9 *--THE PHYSICIANS FOUNDATION*

10 Mix state legislators and Congress into the “change brew” quoted above and you would hear the fear,
11 fatigue, rage and sense of hopelessness about the future in the voices and attitude of your physician
12 colleagues. My frequent conversations with our physician members and my medical association
13 counterparts across the country frequently reflect all of these responses.

14 In short, your state and local medical associations recognize that these are difficult times for physician
15 practices and we continue reorganizing our strategic priorities so we can be there to help where you need
16 us most.

17
18 Over the past few years, we have worked through and revised our strategic plan; our guide to being a
19 physician-driven organization. We’ve asked ourselves, what should we continue to do, undo or redo?
20 Last year, we invited Robert Harris, CAE, a nationally known strategic planning consultant to lead an
21 intensive full day retreat with the Board of Trustees and along with senior staff to begin the process of
22 validating and adapting OSMA’s vision, mission, values and goals to new realities that will help us
23 address the rapid changes in the health care environment and the new federal health care law.

24 There are still some basic questions to address as we face the challenges of this new environment:

- 25
- 26 • How do physicians stay organized when reform initiatives pull them apart and pit them against
27 each other?
 - 28 • How do our members preserve the fundamental patient-physician relationship?
 - 29 • How do physicians retain their stewardship of patient outcomes?
 - 30 • Finally, how does an organization like OSMA that is an advocate for all of our members balance
31 limitless competing yet compelling priorities with a limited budget and staff?

32 OSMA is not alone. Many other medical associations are struggling with similar tensions at a time when
33 economic pressures alone are pushing their members away from each other, or herding them into
34 employed physician relationships inside hospitals or other integrated systems.

35 Below is a summary of some of the OSMA activities that addressed some of these issues:

36 **Sustainable Growth Rate (SGR) Update**

37 Last year, OSMA joined a coalition with all 50 state medical associations and their county component
38 societies to participate in a grass roots patient petition drive to urge Congress to permanently fix the
39 flawed SGR Medicare payment formula.

40 The Medicare sustainable growth rate (SGR) reductions were a constant threat to physicians, their
41 practices and patients throughout 2010. Four times last year physicians were threatened with Medicare
42 reimbursement cuts of over 20 percent. Finally, in December, with the reimbursement cut looming,

1 Congress approved a one-year extension which temporarily freezes the Medicare reimbursement
2 reductions. OSMA participated with many other state and county medical associations in a petition drive
3 that asked patients to join their physicians in writing to members of Congress urging them to stop the
4 Medicare cuts. Over *two thousand Oklahoma patients* joined the effort and these petitions were
5 forwarded with those from other states to Congress.

6 OSMA, OCMS, TCMS and the Rural Physician Section held a news conference in late April of last year
7 to kick off the petition drive at the state capitol. A special thanks to the news conference participants:

13 All participants did an outstanding job of covering the diverse impact the Medicare cuts would have on
14 physicians and their patients (the news conference was posted on the OSMA web site). We also enlisted
15 OU medical students in the petition drive to help get more patients engaged in the grassroots effort.
16 While the cuts are “kicked down the road” again for one year, the reductions will be over 30 percent.
17 OSMA leadership lobbied the Oklahoma Congressional delegation in February of this year and urged
18 them to permanently fix the flawed SGR. We were told by all members of the delegation that they
19 would never let the cuts be implemented but they stopped short of saying a permanent fix would be
20 offered this year. OSMA leadership responded to the disappointment by asking our congressional
21 delegation to at least give OSMA and our members several months notice of any additional temporary
22 extensions so that physicians could mitigate interruption of their practices and hardships on their
23 patients.

24 25 **Medicaid Reimbursement**

26 As you know, OSMA worked hard to stop a proposed additional 3.5 percent Medicaid physician
27 provider cut from the Oklahoma Health Care Authority in 2010. This cut was in addition to an already
28 imposed 3.25 percent cut that physicians had agreed to absorb as part of the proposed state budget
29 reductions. By stopping the additional cuts, *OU physicians alone avoided an estimated \$13-\$15 million*
30 *reduction in physician reimbursement.*

31 OSMA will also be carefully watching the state budget debate regarding Medicaid funding for physician
32 reimbursement. In her first comments on the budget challenges facing the state, Governor Fallin
33 indicated that health funding including Medicaid physician reimbursement could face cuts. We are
34 closely monitoring this issue this session and are optimistic that there will be little if any cuts to the
35 *Sooner Care* program for physician reimbursement in 2011.

36 37 **State Legislative Strategy Conference**

38 Earlier this year, I joined OSMA leadership at the AMA State Legislative Strategy Conference. The
39 conference focused on some of the key legislative issues facing the states:

- 40 • Insurance market reforms;
- 41 • Scope of practice encroachment of physician extenders;
- 42 • Private payer reform;
- 43 • Medical liability reform;
- 44 • Medicaid/CHIP funding and eligibility;
- 45 • Truth in advertising;
- 46 • Program integrity;
- 47 • Public health;
- 48 • Workforce; and
- 49 • State health system reform implementation.

1 Oklahoma, similar to most other states, faces the challenge of implementing large portions of the Patient
2 Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA) while continuing to struggle with major budget shortfalls.

4 **OSMA State Legislative Priorities:**

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6 **Lawsuit Reform**

7 The OSMA Council of Legislation continues to meet as the 2011 Legislature conducts its session
8 through the end of May. Early in the session, newly elected Governor Mary Fallin, State Senate
9 President Pro Tempore Brian Bingman and Speaker of the House Chris Steele all made significant and
10 meaningful lawsuit reform one of their highest priorities for 2011. A package of reforms that included
11 House Bill 2128 authored by the House Speaker Chris Steele, containing a hard \$350,000 cap on non-
12 economic damages has been passed by the House and will be considered by the Senate later in March.
13 The Senate had already passed SB 863 by State Senator Anthony Sykes with a \$250,000 cap. The
14 lawsuit reform package is off to a flying start!

15

16 **Scope of Practice**

17 Over the past four years, OSMA has killed hundreds of scope of practice encroachments by physician
18 extenders. The good news is that this year only 25 such bills have been introduced—a sign that our
19 efforts to educate lawmakers about the importance of physician supervision of these mid level health
20 care providers. Again this year, we are actively seeking a new law that provides for legislative review of
21 agency rules to ensure that the state’s elected officials ultimately approve or disapprove the rules.
22 OSMA is now a recognized leader in protecting physician scope of practice and other state medical
23 societies look to the OSMA/*PatientsFirst* model as the most effective strategy to prevent extender scope
24 creep. We also continue to be active in the AMA’s Scope of Practice Partnership Board of Trustees.

25

26 **Workers Compensation Reform**

27 Legislation has been introduced again by Senator Anthony Sykes to reform Oklahoma’s workers
28 compensation system. The bill might be more aptly named Workers Compensation “deform” in that
29 unfortunately the only group called on to make significant sacrifices is the physician community. SB
30 878 would dramatically impact physician payments under the proposed reforms. As currently drafted,
31 the bill, among other things, would cap provider reimbursement not to exceed 120% of the Medicare
32 rate.

33 OSMA is currently in the field with a brief survey to assess the impact these new limitations would have
34 on physicians’ willingness and ability to continue seeing workers compensation patients. We plan to
35 aggressively lobby legislators to oppose these proposed physician cuts.

36

37 **Tobacco Preemption Legislation**

38 OSMA is a strong supporter of House Bill 2135, legislation that would allow local governments to enact
39 stronger anti-smoking standards than those currently mandated by the state. Oklahoma is only one of
40 two states (with Tennessee) that prohibits or preempts local jurisdictions from enacting stronger tobacco
41 restrictions than those enacted by the states. Unfortunately, the powerful tobacco lobby successfully
42 killed HB 2135 on March 17, the last day House bills were heard on the House floor.

43

44 **Medicine Day 2011**

45 OSMA’s annual Medicine Day event to honor and thank state lawmakers was held Wednesday,
46 February 23 at the OSMA headquarters. As in recent years past, OSMA utilized a phone banking
47 operation to contact physicians and encourage them to join us at the event. **Over 8,000 calls were made
48 over a three-day period and over 150 physicians and legislators attended this year’s event.** OSMA
49 used the remainder of restricted funds that had been provided for tort reform lobbying efforts to fund the
50 phone bank operation. Senate President Pro Tempore Brian Bingman (R-Tulsa) and Senator Anthony
51 Sykes (R-Duncan) (Senate sponsor of the tort reform package) addressed attendees. Physicians had an

1 opportunity to visit with their local legislators about medicine priority legislative concerns: lawsuit
2 reform, scope of practice, and Medicaid reimbursement.

3 This year OSMA invited other medical organization to join us in Medicine Day. The following served
4 as co-sponsors: The Oklahoma Osteopathic Association, the Oklahoma Academy of Family Physicians,
5 the Oklahoma Chapter of the American College of Physicians, the Oklahoma Chapter of the American
6 College of Cardiology, the Oklahoma Chapter of the American Academy of Ophthalmology, and the
7 PatientsFirst Coalition, in addition to our co-sponsor PLICO.

8 9 **AMA National Advocacy Conference:**

10 The AMA's Annual National Advocacy Conference was held February 7-10 in Washington, DC.

11 President K.A. Mehta, MD, OCMS President Robert Cooke, MD, and AMA Board of Directors Member
12 Mary Anne McCaffree, MD, joined us for Capitol Hill visits with the Oklahoma Congressional
13 Delegation. We met with all five Oklahoma Congressmen and both U.S. Senators.

14 Our advocacy efforts focused on the following four primary issues important to Oklahoma physicians:

- 15 • **Medical Liability reform at the federal level.** We asked our delegation to support H.R. 5 by
16 Representative Phil Gingrey, MD, a family practice physician and congressman from Georgia.
17 Entitled the "Help, Efficient, Accessible, Low-cost, Timely Healthcare" HEALTH Act of 2011,
18 this legislation is a comprehensive liability reform measure that would, among other important
19 reforms, include a \$250,000 cap on non-economic damages;
- 20 • **Truth and Transparency Act of 2011.** We asked our delegation to sign on as co-sponsors of
21 Oklahoma Congressman John Sullivan's legislation that would require physicians to identify
22 themselves by their training. Optometrists, chiropractors and doctorate level nurse practitioners,
23 as well as MDs and DOs should be proud of their training and be willing to brand all their
24 advertising with their explicit credentials. This will help patients better understand the education
25 and training their healthcare have as they choose their providers;
- 26 • **Sustainable Growth Rate (SGR) fix.** We asked our delegation to permanently fix the flawed
27 SGR and the uncertainty physicians and their patients face when 30 percent cuts in Medicare
28 reimbursement continue to undermine and threaten the viability of physicians' practices. What
29 we heard in our visits was no strong willingness to permanently fix the SGR, given the current
30 federal budget crisis. Our secondary ask was that if they will not permanently fix the SGR, they
31 should extend the temporary patch early (we asked for two months) so that physicians and their
32 patients won't face the uncertainty of a devastating 30 percent reimbursement cut;
- 33 • **Private contracting.** We asked our delegation to support Medicare beneficiaries' right to
34 privately contract with their physicians if they so choose and not lose their Medicare benefits.
35 The My Doctor, My Choice initiative would end the "all or nothing" choices many Medicare
36 patients and their providing physicians face if they want to continue their relationship in an
37 increasingly unsustainable Medicare reimbursement environment.

38 39 **A Day with the Judges**

40 Last October, OSMA sponsored several practice improvement programs that provided members an
41 opportunity to learn about the latest risk management and practice management issues. Last month, the
42 fourth annual "Day with the Judges" symposium was held at Integris Baptist Hospital in Oklahoma City,
43 attracting 75 attendees. The attendees heard from many of Oklahoma's most senior and experienced
44 judges about the latest legal issues facing physicians and their practices. On a sad note, Oklahoma Chief
45 Justice Marion Opala, who was scheduled to be the keynote speaker and moderator for the meeting,
46 passed away on October 3rd just five days before the Symposium.

1 **EMR Conference**

2 Last month, OSMA partnered with PLICO to sponsor its third annual Electronic Medical Records
3 Conference. We had over 150 attendees and 15 exhibitors at this year's CME meeting. A second
4 condensed CME course is planned for OSMA's annual meeting in Tulsa. Also as part of OSMA's
5 upcoming Road Shows, a shorter course will be developed to help physicians migrating to the world of
6 electronic health records.

7 *Note: Both of these seminars produced significant non-dues revenue for OSMA.*

8
9 **OSMA/SMRTNet Legal Agreement**

10 The legal agreement between OSMA and SMRTNet regarding the OSMA Portal and the Health
11 Information Exchange (HIE) relationship has essentially been completed. A meeting of the HIT
12 Governance Committee has been scheduled for March 24 and following that meeting that will include a
13 discussion of pricing for OSMA member and non-member participation in the portal, a final agreement
14 should be executed.

15
16 **OU Physicians Group Membership Update**

17 Since last year's report, President Mehta, MD, Doug Folger, MD, Robert McCaffree, MD, and I met
18 with interim OU Physicians Group CMO, Cameron Mantor, MD to discuss the proposed group
19 academic physician membership program. Dr. Mehta plans to provide an update on the meeting in his
20 remarks at the annual meeting.

21
22 **OSMA Road Shows**

23 OSMA continues to actively schedule road shows to bring OSMA's message and presence to many
24 areas of the state that see little activity otherwise. In addition to presenting information about OSMA's
25 legislative and political activities, CME is often provided that is focused on physician supervision
26 responsibilities as outlined in the Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision rules. This year we will
27 add a new CME module focused on helping physicians planning to migrate to electronic health records.
28 Our road show team typically includes OSMA President K.A. Mehta, MD, OSMA Executive Director
29 Ken King, CAE, OSMA Associate Executive Director Kathy Musson, CAE, Council on State
30 Legislation Chair Jack Beller, MD, OSMA lobby team of Pat Hall and Jim Dunlap, PLICO and PLICO
31 Financial marketing professionals, local/regional OSMA leadership when available and appropriate
32 OSMA staff.
